<b>Blueberry, Draper</b> – Developed at MSU and renowned for its hardiness, Draper is an ideal blueberry plant for edible landscaping around the home. Early midseason ripening in a short period and is very productive. Draper grows to 4 feet in height. \$8 each, 3 for \$21, 5 for \$32.50		
<b>Blueberry, BlueJay</b> – Enjoy long harvests of flavorful blueberries that hang well right on the bush. These vigorous plants also make a lovely addition to any yard, especially in fall when the leaves turn yellow and orange. Perfect for northern gardens. Resists cracking, ripens in July, self-pollinating. \$8 each, 3 for \$21, 5 for \$32		
<b>Strawberry, Earliglow</b> – June bearing – Large jewel-like, dark red berries. Wonderful flavor, the plant is vigorous and produces many runners that increase your crop year after year. 25 for \$10, 50 for \$18		
<b>Strawberry, Albion</b> – ever-bearing – Very large fruit that is mostly conical, very firm and red in color. Its flavor is very good. 25 for \$10, 50 for \$18		
<b>Grape, Concord</b> – Are not particular about soil pH, cold hardy, and they are strong, reliable producers once established. The best for table grapes, juice grapes, grape jelly, and candy. You can eat Concord grapes with or without the skin or with or without the seeds. All parts of the Concord grape are good for you! \$9 each, 3 for \$25.50, 5 for \$39		
<b>Grape, Cayuga</b> – This versatile, sweet, tasty white grape is ideal for fresh eating and winemaking. It is one of the most productive and disease resistant varieties Cornell University released specifically for winemaking. Ripens mid-September. \$14 each, 3 for \$38, 5 for \$60		
<b>Grape, Traminette</b> – A late mid-season white grape that is distinguished by its superior wine quality combined with good productivity, partial resistance to several fungal diseases and superior cold hardiness. Ripens early to mid-October. \$14 each, 3 for \$38, 5 for \$60		
<b>Eastern US Pollinator Mix Wildflower Seed</b> – An easy-to-grow mixture that features a variety of wildflowers that is formulated to attract and feed pollinators.
